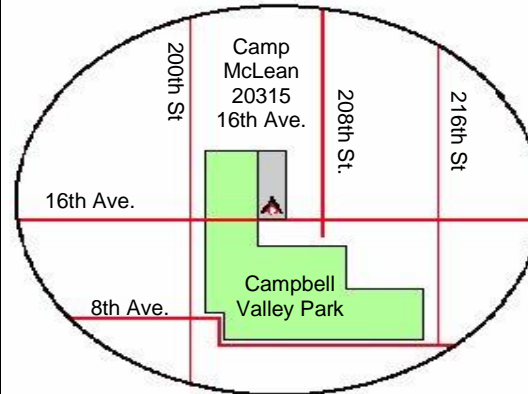

SUMMER CUB CAMP 2018

This year's theme is:

Wild Wild West

For those who want to get a feel of what the Summer Cub Camp is all about, mark on your calendars May 12th 2018. We will be holding an Open House at Camp McLean the location of our yearly camp. Come talk to our staff, look at pictures and crafts from previous years, as well as join in on a tour and get an appreciation of the area.

Camp McLean is 50 acres of forested land nestled in the Campbell Valley just across the road from the regional park on 16th Avenue. On one side there is the Campbell River which is part of the nature conservancy in the GVRD; on the other side is a GVRD park where occasional campers will camp through the year. Camp McLean has hosted many events throughout its 40 plus years of existence. It has been the site of the Summer Cub Camp for 32 years.

The Summer Cub Camp consists of 5, one week camps. Each week begins on the Sunday at 1:00pm and ends at 10:00am the following Saturday. The Cubs will sleep in cabins with the exception of one night, where they get to experience what it is like to be a Scout in an area locally known as the outback. You will be able to view the outback at the open house. During the week there are a number of activities your youth will get to join in: handicrafts, swimming, archery, canoeing, games and campfires, to list a few.

Handicrafts

Each year of the Summer Cub Camp the youth get to build a craft that is in keeping with the theme. We are currently looking at various ideas for a wooden type craft. Some of the crafts that we have made in the past will be displayed at the Open House.

Swimming

Campers will enjoy our onsite pool with certified life guard on hand.

Archery

The archery range is housed close to the car park in an open wooden structure. The youth get to learn how to use a bow and arrow, and on the Friday a competition is held to see who the archer of the week is.

Canoeing

Just up the hill from camp McLean on the same side of 16th Avenue, is a pathway that leads to a small lake that is surrounded by meadow and trees. While paddling through the lily pads and open water, the youth will get to experience various fun activities throughout the week.

Campfires

After hot chocolate and cookies a campfire is set in the rotary fire pit close by, and the youth get to participate in songs, skits and cheers, and listen to stories.



Outback

The Outback program is a camp within the camp with a purpose to give the Cub aged youth a chance to experience some of the types of activities that they can expect when they move up to Scouts. They get to experience sleeping under a tarp shelter, cooking, learning how to use a compass, playing games, and before they go to bed there is a campfire where they can practice their songs, skits and cheers for the Friday theme campfire.

Evening activities

On Thursday a kangaroo court is held and the youth get to participate as the jury, whilst the Cabin Leaders are charged with various misdemeanours. There are also wide games and usually a special activity each year.

Movie Night

One of the evenings will be a movie night. A big screen with a movie fitting our Spy theme and Popcorn too!

Waterslides

On Thursday, the youth get to spend a fun day in the sun and water at the waterslides.

Theme Day Friday

Each Friday, a number of theme based activity stations are put together for an afternoon of enjoyment and competition. Similar to Cuboree, we'll go around stations accumulating points and the winning cabin team gets a prize

Kitchen

The food is excellent. We have a full time cook with kitchen assistance. There are three meals and three snacks daily- nobody goes hungry!



First Aid

Please make sure that the First Aider on your week of camp has all the information they need on your youth. If your youth has allergies please make sure the First Aider has the necessary details and medications.

Cabin Leaders

The cabin leaders are Venturer aged youth (14-16), they are chosen for the way they interact with the youth.

attending must be 9, 10, 11 in 2018 as well.
